Just as her life seemed to be coming together, tragedy struck the family, not once, but three times. First, a flood devastated their home, then it was destroyed by fire. Gloria was saved by her 16-year old son who knocked down the door that had trapped his mother. Following the fire their home was repeatedly robbed and stripped of everything of value. Despite these tragedies, Gloria remains committed to make Bridgeport a better place.

Together the Browns have founded a variety of outreach programs, including a youth-based radio show and heading up the local chapter of the NAACP. Gloria also founded the Bridgeport community annual festival, which unites the area. Now it is the Brown's turn to receive some help.

Gribin was attracted to the Brown's situation having served in leadership positions on numerous community and non-profit organizations. Says Gribin, "I am very fortunate to be able to work on exceptional projects, but some of the ones that I am most proud of are those that truly make a difference in their communities." Gribin's construction management skills were instrumental in delivering the newly renovated American Red Cross headquarters in Greenwich 15% below budget and value-engineering \$3.5million in savings for the first transitional housing facility for mentally ill homeless adults in Manhattan. Recent residential projects include the renovation and home addition to a 1950's Southport, CT colonial that incorporates modern amenities while retaining the house's original charm and the gut-renovation of a 13,000 square foot Greenwich home (in association with Hobbs, Inc.), which was awarded a 2006 HOBI for Best Remodeled Home by the Connecticut Home Builders and Remodelers Association.

The episode "Brown Family" is scheduled to air during the 2007-2008 season.
